It will be a FANCY DRESS FUN RUN, bring your own costume, which can be anything from a Santa suit to a gorilla in a tutu! Let your imagination go wild and let us raise a really nice sum for the Midlands Air Ambulance Charity. If you want some ideas then search 'Fun Run' in Google images and you will find lots of good ideas. No military uniforms please, we want this to be a FUN run. You can run, jog or walk, wheelchairs, dogs on leads and pushchairs are welcome. The run will be started by the Mayor of Telford & Wrekin Councillor Rae Evans and we hope to have Blind Dave Heeley in attendance who is a remarkable marathon runner, including the 777 Challenge and is now an ambassador for the Midlands Air Ambulance Charity. As last year, you can pre register online for £5 and agree to try and raise at least £20, or you can fill out a form from the Visitor Centre. However, do not leave registering until the day, as it will be £20 on the day to make up for the fact that you will have no time to raise sponsorship. 2016 is the 25th Anniversary of the Midlands Air Ambulance. The invaluable work they carry out in saving lives on a daily basis cannot be overstated and any one of us could need their services at any time. Each flight averages out a £2,500, so your support will be very much appreciated in helping to keep our Air Ambulance service flying. The Midlands Air Ambulance receive no government or other official funding, so voluntary support is essential. Please join in the fun on Sunday 4 December and do your very best to raise at least £20 and hopefully lots more. We''ll see you there, in your fancy dress of course!

## **FOUNTAINS & WATERFALL**





Success at last! After 3 years of our lovely fountains and waterfall in the Chelsea and Maxell Gardens not working and a successful application for a grant to SUEZ (formerly SITA) work is now under way to restore them to their former glory.

The initial stage will be draining and relining the round pond to make it watertight and the Friends will be assisting with this part of the project.

The work is expected to be completed by the end of November and there should be minimum disruption for visitors to the gardens but we wish to apologise for any inconvenience during the essential works.

The eight stone troughs by the round pond will be moved to form a new Alpine Garden just beyond the bronze horse towards the rear of the gardens..

The fountain in the round pond will have the addition of being synchronised to music, as per the original, something a lot of people have asked if we could have again. Music to our ears!

The second pond further on will have a flowing bird bath as it was originally, which will greatly enhance the water quality as well as look attractive and provide a bath for wildlife.

The waterfall used to be a magnificent site in the Maxell Garden and once the trees are trimmed back will once again become quite spectacular and a big draw for visitors from all over the Midlands.

We are also hoping that next year we can obtain some new sculptures from the British Ironwork Centre for 2017 to bring even more added interest to the gardens.

Watch out for announcements for when it will all be officially opened.

# Friends 4 Health







Friends 4 Health is a brand new scheme this year to promote, through health professionals, working outdoors in a garden or park environment to help patients recover from physical or mental ill health.

The scheme has been rolled out across Telford to GP's and Nurses and other health professionals and health voluntary groups so that people can be referred to the Friends group and take part in gardening, hedge laying, scrub clearing and other conservation projects.

We recently attended a Clinical Commissioning Group meeting in Wellington of GP's and Nurses to promote the scheme to health professionals.

It has been proven beyond all doubt that being out of doors in the fresh air and doing something that occupies you for an hour or two is wholly beneficial for anyone's health. The tasks will only be whatever the individual is capable of and carries no commitment or cost and this includes the NHS. So it is a WIN - WIN situation for all concerned.

The scheme is aimed at women over 25 and men over 50 and is supported by 'Fit for Life' and Telford & Wrekin Sport & Recreation Trust. However, anyone over 16 years of age can come along and give it a go, you do not have to be referred by your doctor or nurse. We have a selection of tools which are designed for the less able available and any essential protective wear such as gloves will be provided.

The sessions currently run in the Chelsea Gardens, Telford Town Park every **Wednesday from 9.15am till 1pm** and every **1**<sup>st</sup> **and 3**<sup>rd</sup> **Saturday** at the same times. Just pop along and introduce yourself.

# Gardening news

Several of the wood and tile gazebos have recently been spruced up and make the entrance to the Maxell Garden look a very attractive prospect! There is still another one to do, so volunteer painters will be most welcome! The picture shows the main entrance from the rear of the SW 1 library to the Maxell Garden.





We have now replaced the fish sculpture that was vandalised a few months ago. It is being replanted with grasses including Zebra grass and should now be able to be enjoyed again by all visitors including the less able amongst us.

One of the original 1979 gazebo features is now suffering with wood rot and so it will be reduced in size and the whole area made to look attractive again shortly. The old ponds either side are being gradually turned into bog gardens.





Thanks to the generosity of David Austin Roses, Albrighton, the archways leading to the Maxell Garden and the Friends Sensory Garden will be graced with 4 new climbing roses.

Delivery of these is expected at the beginning of November as dry root stock, which will then be planted up by the Friends ready for a stunning display next year, hopefully.!

Shropshire Star

The British Ironwork Centre near Oswestry has now obtained over 5,000 signatures to try and get the Knife Angel sculpture by Alfie Bradley on the fourth plinth in Trafalgar Square.

This amazing piece of art has been created from over 100,000 knives and other other dangerous weapons handed in and confiscated by police forces all over the UK.

It will be available to view for a short time on weekdays at the Ironwork Centre on request at reception. Admission is free. If you have never visited this amazing
