

There is no doubt that in these days of cut backs everywhere, the Town Park included, we have made a difference to the ongoing maintenance of the park for the benefit of all the community.

Some of our projects have involved the restoration of the Crannog on Grange Pool, the replacement of the wind vane on the Queens Jubilee Monument, the replacement of the old sensory garden, doing a large amount of hedge laying and scrub clearing and currently building a large bug hotel in the Stumpery area of the Chelsea Gardens. The Friends were also heavily involved in obtaining the £49,500 grant funding from SUEZ to reinstate the 2 fountains and the waterfall in the Chelsea and Maxell Gardens, which are now complete. NEW SIGNAGE

Following a meeting with the heads of department at Telford & Wrekin Council, the Friends have secured funding for the provision of some new information boards within the Chelsea and Maxell Gardens. The signs will hopefully be installed in time for the Sakura Festival on 21 April.

The original Chelsea gardens all had names and the intention is to rename them along with historical pictures and text.

Watch out for these new signs appearing some time in the spring. They will be similar in appearance to the one in the Stumpery.

Yet more plans afoot, with the hope that some bee hives can be installed in the Town Park. The location has yet to be decided but they will be operated by fully trained volunteers.

The hope is that it will be a further encouragement for bees to multiply and who knows we nay have some park honey for sale! Watch this space as the well known saying goes!





Did you know?

The Chelsea Gardens were originally three different gardens that were designed by David Wassell, MBE, in conjunction with Telford Development Corporation for the Chelsea Flower Shows of 1977, 78 & 79. The first two gardens won silver gilt medals and the third won a gold medal. It was then decided to reconstruct the gardens within Telford Town Park. The current Friends Sensory Garden was originally laid out as a rose garden but it was decided to turn it into a sensory garden to replace the one lost with the development of Southwater.



You can walk through Telford Town Park, go south along the Silkin Way all the way to The Gorge, the museums and Ironbriidge itself.

It is about 7 miles and is mainly a downhill stroll of 2 - 3 hours depending on how fast you like to walk. If you are not up to walking back there is always the bus! Or you could hire a bike from the Visitor Centre.

Why not invest in an OS map and enjoy lots of interesting sites along the way.
