Chairman's Report 2024 - 2025



An Exciting Year of Growth and Collaboration

It has been an exciting year for the friends, with many projects started and firms coming on board to assist us.

We extend special thanks to Simmonds Transport, who are aiding us with the project at the Grange pool and Crannog within the town park. This area has not received much attention in the past, so we are working to revive it. With their help, we are creating a learning zone so that everyone can learn about the wildlife within the town park, from the bugs to the birds. We are also planning to replace the bridge over the Crannog to construct a bird hide. The willow arch is being extended, and more saplings have been planted within the hedgerow. The seating has been repaired in the "Onion" and all the benches have painted. Over the coming year we are planning to give the paths some attention, erect more bird and bug boxes and complete the learning zone.

Fujitsu has also been helping on another project to recreate a lizard and snake sanctuary, which will allow the community to observe and photograph the wildlife without disturbing it.

Lyreco has been instrumental in helping within the Chelsea Gardens by moving one of the display beds to a different position so that all may continue to enjoy it. They are also helping to repaint one of the bridges over the Silken Way this coming year.

We have also undertaken repairs to our shed, which has sprung leaks in the roof and developed holes in the floor!

Our next project within the gardens will be to build a polytunnel so that vegetables may be grown all year round and then given out to those in need. We are also creating a woodland garden, replanting another bank, and creating a Fuchsia garden.

My thanks go out to all the volunteers, old and new, who have supported me and given up their time over the last year to help make Telford Town Park a great place to visit.

Also our thanks go to our many sponsors- Brown and Brown (formerly Henshall's insurance brokers), Simmonds transport, Southwater event group, J&PR ltd, Lyreco, Fujitsu, Telford and Wrekin Council and local parish councils.

Did you know ?

The Shropshire Canal used to run through the middle of the Town Park but was soon superceded by the London and North Western Railway (LNWR). However this company was taken over by the London Midland and Scottish railway in 1923 (LMS) and subsequently British Railways in 1948. The railway through the park closed to passenger traffic in 1952 and to goods in 1956. The original platform for Dawley and Stirchley railway station was restored a few years ago with help from the National Lottery. It now sits on what has become the Silkin Way, a walking and cycling route to Ironbridge.
